MESSAGE FROM THE COMMODORE

Phased Opening of HSC Club House

The Committee had a 'ZOOM' meeting this Monday in order to consider the recent Government announcements regarding Phase 3 and further relaxation of the the Covid 19 guidelines. As you can all imagine, the guidance is wide open to interpretation in many areas so we are proceeding cautiously while also watching what the local hospitality/sports community is doing.

Government guidelines are "indoor facilities, apart from toilets and through-ways, should be kept closed" with regards to sport clubs so we must adhere to this strictly for now.

Therefore, following a risk assessment review by the Covid subcommittee and the perceived degree of complexity in opening the bar at this stage, we see no value in opening the main hall of the clubhouse as this means unnecessary cleaning of an unused space. Nevertheless, we are actively looking at ways of using the galley to provide tea/coffee/snacks out of the back door on the days when there are organised sailing/paddler events.

However, the Committee is pleased to announce that the toilets will be reopened to members on a trial basis on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays as from the 08.07.2020. The Changing rooms and showers are not to be used. If larger groups are planning activities on other days, then get in touch with one of the committee and we will endeavour to open up the club for you so that you can use the toilets.

We ask that the following guidelines be observed when entering the clubhouse to use the toilets.

- 1. Please always be aware of your surroundings and other people passing in and out of the clubhouse, to ensure you maintain social distancing guidelines at all times.
- 2. To allow for free movement of air the windows of the toilets will be opened and the external doors to the toilets will be wedged open. This will also assist with social distancing.
- 3. Within each cubicle and urinal area there will be a sanitiser spray. Please use this to sanitise the toilet flush's, toilet seats and cubicle doors etc before /after use.
- 4. Soap and sanitiser will be on the wash basin tops for personal usage. Please follow government guidelines regarding personal hand hygiene.
- 5. No changing is to take place in the toilet cubicles or foyer of the club house. So please still arrive prepared to Sail, Kayak or Windsurf as previously advised.

6. If you have a temperature, feel unwell or have any suspected COVID 19 symptoms, please stay home and stay safe for the sake of our members

To Assist the committee in establishing the volume of usage it would be appreciated if a mark could be made on the chalk board in the foyer when leaving. (see signage)

The committee is regularly reviewing the situation and we will continue to act on new government advice as and when it is made available.
